No matter how much you think you are helping someone, occasionally you need to hear from the people you are helping to provide a reality check. Here are two:

From Joanna Tarr, Children's advocate, Broadview Shelter & Transitional Housing:

"We greatly appreciate the stockings, the goodies inside, and the time you spent collecting the gifts and assembling the stockings..... a mother who was at our program last year was giving a speech and showed two paper stockings that she made for herself and son last year so that they would have stockings. She said that she was overjoyed to receive an actual stocking for her son, filled with goodies and not have to use the paper one! She said that it helped make her unit a home."

From Polly Gerrish, St. Vincent de Paul Stella Maris House:

"It is disheartening for a mom to have to resort to a shelter at any time of year, but it becomes especially hard during the holidays. Your thoughtful, caring and kind gesture of giving helped the residents to know that they are not forgotten and gave them hope for a brighter tomorrow. Thank you for thinking of our homeless children, by doing so, you have brought smiles to the faces of our children and relief to our concerned Mom's. this was a Christmas they will always remember because of your kindness. I am most confident that you have made a huge difference in their lives in the years to come."

You are making a difference and research shows that affirmations and encouragement along with showing that someone cares can make all the difference in the world to children and will affect them for the rest of their lives. We truly appreciate the thoughtful contributions and over 16,000 volunteer hours to Holiday Stockings for Homeless Children. With your help in 2018 we prepared 4606 colorful stockings to 104 locations and shelters. This was an increase from last year of 263 stockings that we felt comfortable to afford because of your generosity.

But the challenge remains and we need your continued support and involvement. The homeless problem is overwhelming and it is not going away anytime soon. The state Office of Superintendent of Public Instruction released data Thursday showing that more than 40,000 public school students in the state are experiencing homelessness - that's an increase of more than 1,200 over the 2015-16 count, and an increase of more than 10,000 since 2013.

giving back. Her daughter Jordyn (11 years) who has come since she was one has this to say: *"I have been helping since I was one year old. I love going and stuffing the stockings because I love thinking about the kids smiles when they get to open the stockings. It's always packed when we go to stuff the stockings, there are always long lines; that is good though because that means that there are lots of people willing to spare their own time to make children happy that Christmas."* Riley (5 years old) says she likes picking out cute toys for the little kids.

My son just moved back to this area and his children helped last year, but this was his first year for him and his wife to attend and he had this to say, *"Although, my family has done the stocking stuffers for many years this was my first year we had the opportunity to give back and what a joy it was! From an early age my mother instilled an importance of giving back and from that early on-set I have had a soft spot for the homeless and less fortunate. Giving back in a way that is so simple yet can have such a profound impact on other's lives is an easy decision. The most impactful part of the event is wrapping my head around the fact of how much reach an operation like this has. Although we were present for stuffing of the stockings, it is incredible to think of the number of hours that went into getting the event prepared for that moment. We were honored to help get the stockings stuffed. And, we are proud to be part of the operation."*

Information about Volunteering Dec 6 & 7

Open registration begins September 1 and ends December 1, 2019 for this year's event. You can register to volunteer to sort items on Friday, December 6th from 2:00 – 6:00pm, and/or to stuff stockings on Saturday, December 7th from 10:00am - 12:00pm.

Register with Bobette Scheid, bobette@holidaystockings.org or (206) 232-9854 and specify the Friday and/or Saturday event. As space fills quickly, we recommend groups sign up early. Give us the approximate number attending and then you may add group member names up until the Dec. 1 deadline. We suggest a 1:3 adult/child ratio for all children under age 12.

Because this is held at a military installation base security requires all volunteer names 16 years and up to be submitted as they appear on their photo ID by Dec. 1

All vehicles must have proof of insurance and registration to enter the base. Also, all person's age 16 and up must have photo ID. Contact Bobette@holidaystockings.org for specifics.

Please consider volunteering as a shelter captain on Saturday, December 7. It requires some extra responsibilities, but it is more fun and rewarding to deliver boxes of stockings to a shelter.




Sew, Knit, Crochet


